

# R4HSSS 3<sup>rd</sup> Year Research Plan

October 2022

## Background

As per R4HSSS research management policy, the project develops annual research plans that identifies key research priorities for the health system(s) in northern Syria. For the third year of the project (October 2022 to October 2023), the process of developing this plan involved the following steps:

- An online survey that was shared among R4HSSS team as well as R4HSSS partners and networks to propose new research ideas under each workstream.
- The findings of the research were discussed in R4HSSS Executive Board meeting in Gaziantep in September 2022.
- Further one to one consultation to collect more research ideas was conducted between August and October 2022.
- A research planning session was conducted during R4HSSS dissemination conference in Gaziantep in September 2022. During this conference, we collected feedback and research ideas from a wide range of partners.

## Current research projects

The following table includes all research projects that have already started under R4HSSS in the last two years. The priority of this year is to continue the implementation of some of these research that have not been concluded in the last year. This list includes only original research that involves primary data collection; it does not include opinion pieces that can be found on R4HSSS website.
